

May Meeting Recap: Issues & Opportunities

People have **difficulty crossing N Smith St** due to speeding vehicles


People noted a lack of comfortable walking and biking routes between N Lombard and N Fessenden

An opportunity to improve transit access and connections near the plaza

People would like **better walking and biking connections** along **the railroad cut**.

People would like to see more frequent crossings on N Lombard, especially near Roosevelt High School

People noted the need for **safer walking and biking conditions** on **N Willamette Blvd** and
the **St Johns Bridge**



Additional Takeaways from May Meeting

A need for **better connections to nearby neighborhoods** & destinations



Traffic Calming is a NEIGHBORHOOD issue, not just a street-by-street issue.

Look for opportunities to add additional green space and tree canopy.

Wayfinding is needed, and not just on Neighborhood Greenways.

What makes a good North Portland in Motion project?

Identifying projects that are:

- Responsive to community identified priorities
- Aligned with PBOT's transportation goals & policies
- Able to be delivered in the near-term by PBOT



North Portland in Motion Project Types

We want to begin a conversation about new project ideas by introducing **4 project types.**

There are dozens of project ideas throughout North Portland, with 11 in St Johns specifically.

Together, they build a complete and comprehensive network of safer, more accessible streets.

Corridor Improvements

Corridor Improvements make investments to reduce speeding and improve safety on busier streets in the neighborhood.

Example Locations in St Johns:

- **N Smith St** (St Louis to Columbia Way)
- **N Ida Ave** (Willamette to Central)
- N Macrum Ave (Fessenden to Columbia





Neighborhood Greenways

Neighborhood Greenways are shared neighborhood streets with slow speeds that connect people to important community destinations like schools, parks, commercial areas.

Example Locations in St Johns:

- N Burr & N Buchanan
- N Charleston
- N Willamette & N Reno
- N Gilbert
- N Jersey
- N Bank & Bristol





Critical Connections

Critical Connections bridge **major barriers** connecting North Portland neighborhoods to each other and the rest of the City of Portland.

Example Locations in St Johns:

- N Fessenden
- N Lombard*





Plazas & Public Spaces

Plazas & Public Spaces are hubs of community, connection, information exchange, and activation.

Example Locations:

- St Johns Plaza
- Charleston Ave (between Lombard & Central)
